

Dir. Jalmair Helander | 2023 | 91 mins | English / Finnish

During the last desperate days of WWII, a solitary gold prospector crosses paths with Nazis on a scorched-earth retreat in northern Finland. When the Nazis steal his gold, they discover they have just tangled with no ordinary miner. This legendary ex-commando embodies what sisu means: a white-knuckled form of courage and unimaginable determination in the face of overwhelming odds. The duo have developed into thrilling exponents of traditional tunes and songs, repurposing the material as jumping-off points into exquisite explorations of the liminal space that exists between traditional and classical music.
