The Poly's annual lecture series, given in memory

of Paul Smales – a friend of The Poly for many years who made a great contribution to many Cornish institutions. This year's lecture will be delivered by mining historian Ben Sumpter.

Ben's talk tracks the exploration of Cornwall's secret underworld. Underground spaces are among the most rarely visited places and present a frontier of exploration for cavers and explorers. What remains today of Cornwall's once bustling tin, copper and sundry metal mines hidden beneath our countryside?

Ben runs Cornwall Underground Adventures and has spent most of his life exploring underground spaces around the world. He is a research consultant specialising in mining history, geology, classics and archaeology, and lead investigator of the Kassiteros Project, which investigates early metallurgy in ancient literature. Ben regularly gives talks on subjects ranging from caving to church history and quantum physics.
